A friend recently asked me about Ash Wednesday, the season of Lent and their significance to the Easter celebration. Harper's Bible Dictionary defines them as follows:

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent and the seventh Wednesday before Easter. It derives its name from the early ecclesiastical custom of putting ashes on the heads of believers on that day, as a sign of penitence.

Lent, among Christians originally the period of prebaptismal preparation, later of public penance. Finally it became a forty-day devotional preparation for Easter traditionally based on Jesus' wilderness fast (Mark 1:13).

I don't think I have ever worn ashes on my head to show a sign of penitence. I know that still today, several denominations do this as part of their preparation for the celebration of Easter. (An outward sign of an inward identification with Christ) What about you?

I know that my heart remembers when I first met Jesus. There are times when I share in his suffering. Does he see the ashes on my heart? Does he really know that I remember what he's done for me? I certainly hope so...from ashes to beauty, just like our Lord. (Is 61)

Recently, in one of our *GriefShare* video's, a speaker said, "We live... we die... we live again." We will all trade in our ashes for beauty, and those united with Christ will live with him again.

Traps and Fruit

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. He separated the land from the waters. He caused living things to grow and flourish. He made cats to make kitties, sheep to make lambs, and people and goats to make kids. He beautifully and perfectly designed a garden for man kind to live in.

The garden was not a place that mankind was restricted to. God didn't make a garden and then say "Don't go past the driveway on that side, don't cross the street on that side, and don't go into the neighbors yards." He actually invites these people, made in His image, to eat of all of the seed bearing plants in the whole earth. God made man kind to be free to partake of all of the fruits and pleasures that can be found in the world, and may come and go from the garden as they please. In fact it was the garden that poured life into the rest of creation as the headwater of the whole earth's life-spring.

At the very center of this life-giving garden were two trees. One tree had fruit on it that gave life without restriction, and the other offered the knowledge of good and evil. The second tree did not simply open the eyes of those who ate of it to the fact there are good things as well as bad things, but it offered an intimate experience with evil. The serpent, oh so crafty was he, was able to draw mans attention away from the limitless beauty and freedom that God had created, and managed to focus their minds and hearts and attitudes on the one tiny, truly insignificant thing that they were instructed not to eat.

They ate. They sinned.

Some time later Jesus would be teaching the Jewish nation about God, and faith, and love. He would use pictures that His hearers would be able to relate to and understand. One instance He happened to be teaching about sin, and what it actually is, and what it actually does. He said sin is actually like slavery. Now the Jews have a history full of slavery, and oppression and pain and suffering, they were all too familiar with what slavery was like. Jesus said when you choose to intimately know evil, when you choose to deeply experience the very things that are in direct opposition to what I designed and purposed you for, your actually becoming slaves to those choices.

One might say that Jesus even brings us back to the center of the garden to remind us of the two trees. He's telling His listeners that each time we eat of the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, instead of experiencing the abundance of life and joy and pleasure and freedom that God has created us in, we are focusing on this forbidden thing and in turn ensnares us. Jesus says this traps us in a cycle where we can't help but continually choose to eat of the forbidden tree and we fall deeper and deeper into our own traps, and the slavery of sin and instead of participating in the life we were created for we choose to look the other way and it looks like death and fear and sadness. And eventually we've forgotten about the tree of life and are so trapped that we can't even eat of the life giving tree any longer.

Jesus then draws their attentions and intention and hearts and minds and very souls to the fact that He is actually offering us the fruit of the tree of life once again. He's reminding us that there is life to be had, and that He came to free His image bearers from the slavery of sin, from the traps that we lay for ourselves. He's come to give life abundantly, to heal the sick and help those lost find their way back to the life, the freedom and the beauty in which they were first created. He is... the tree of life.


